Under the terms of the current Master Labor Agreement covering 11 Southern California Counties, the Southern California District Council of Laborers has allocated the increase, effective July 1, 2011. A total of \$ 2.00 per hour has been allocated as follows: \$ 1.00 per hour to Health and Welfare, \$.96 per hour to wages and \$.04 per hour to Laborers Trusts' Administrative Trust Fund.

The minimum hourly base wage rates and classifications appear on pages 2, 3 and 4.

Foremen: Laborer Foremen employed in accordance with the Agreement shall be paid not less than \$1.75 per hour more than the hourly wage rate of the highest Laborer over which they have leadership on their regular crew. In the event the Contractor, at his option, elects to use a Laborer Foreman to supervise other Laborer Foremen, he shall be paid not less than \$1.00 per hour more than the hourly rate of the highest classified Laborer Foreman over whom he has leadership.

Overtime: Time and one-half, except hours worked over 12 in a single workday, Sundays and holidays, which are double (2) time.

Subsistence: Subsistence shall be paid at the rate of \$45.00 per scheduled workday. Subsistence as provided in the Agreement shall be paid on jobs on the following offshore islands:
